"We are extremely pleased Christian Social Services of Morehead was chosen as one of



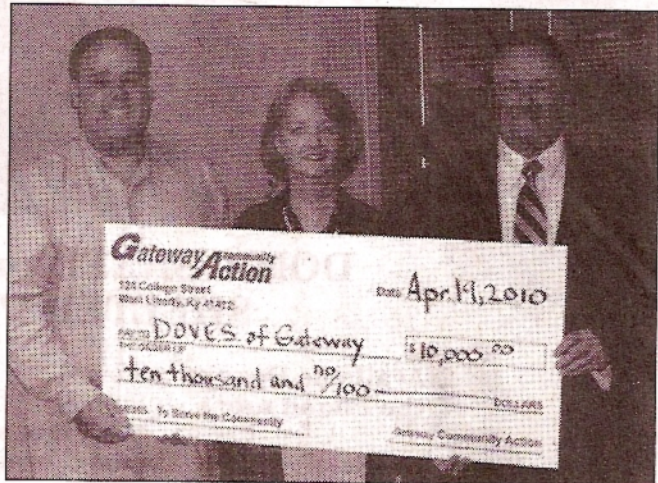

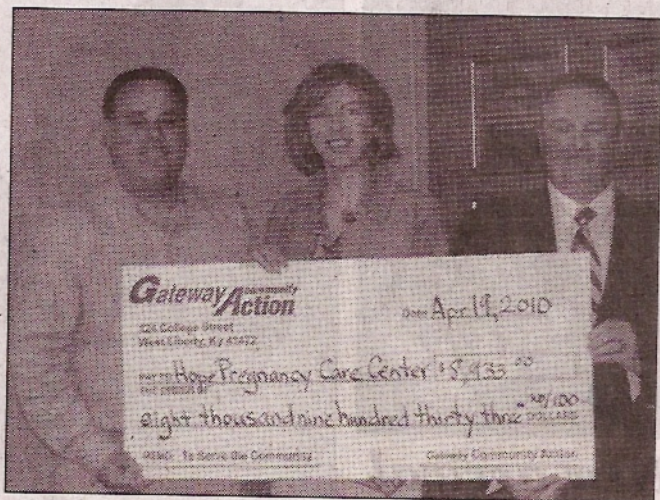
