Transportation Updates

Gateway has received the 5311 grant award from the Kentucky Department of Transportation for Fiscal Year 2017. This funding will allow us to continue providing public transportation in Morgan County.

Our long term goal is to expand demand-response transportation to other counties as the need is identified.

Kentucky Career Center JobSight



On August 31st the Kentucky Career Center JobSight/WIOA Staff hosted a multi-employer Job Fair at the Morgan County Youth and Wellness Center. Approximately 15 employers and 50 job seekers were in attendance. Of the Job Fair attendees, 3 have gained employment with 5 having interviews and hoping for a call back.

KCC JobSight/WIOA staff toured the Teleworks USA Hub in Beattyville, KY on

September 7th. The Beattyville Teleworks Hub opened in April 2016 with support from the City of Beattyville, Lee County Fiscal Court and the Appalachian Regional Commission. The Hub features 19 workstations and six additional terminals for our customizable online digital literacy, tech support, and customer service workshops featuring 72 hours of coursework designed to prepare prospective teleworkers for jobs with a variety of employers

Health Benefit Assister Program

Open Enrollment Period - The yearly period when people can enroll in a health insurance plan for 2018



coverage begins on November 1, 2017 through December 15, 2017.

Enrolling in or changing coverage outside the Open Enrollment Period, may require a qualifying event such as but not limited to:

- getting married
- having a baby
- losing other health coverage.

You can apply and/or enroll in Medicaid or the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) any time of year.

Weatherization Assistance Program



Winter is quickly approaching so now is the time to do an assessment of your home to be prepared for winter. The following tips from Gateway's Weatherization Assistance Program will not only save you money but will also help keep you and your family safer this winter.

- 1. Replace the batteries in your smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors. Smoke alarms should be replaced at least every 10 years and carbon monoxide detectors should be replaced every 5-7 years.
- 2. Clean out the gutters. Clogged gutters and drains can form ice dams. When the ice melts it can seep into your home and cause all sorts of issues such as mold and mildew.
- 3. Disconnect and drain all outside hoses. Leaving a hose connected to the outside spigot can cause water in the hose to freeze and transfer to the water line.
- 4. Wrap water pipes in your basement or crawl space with insulation sleeves to slow heat transfer. Be especially mindful of pipes that may have frozen in the past.
- 5. Consider an insulated blanket for your hot water heater and lower the hot water temperature.
- 6. f you have a fireplace, keep the flue closed when you're not using it. Also remember to keep the area around the opening of the fireplace clear of any combustible material.
- 7. Keep the outside air out and the inside air in. Warm air will escape out of any cracks and openings and can make your heating system work harder costing you more money. Use caulk to seal cracks and openings around doors and windows and consider using weather-stripping to seal all outside doors. If you can see daylight when the door is closed you can be assured it is leaking air.
- 8. Turn down your thermostat. As a rule of thumb, you can save about 3% on your heating bill for every degree you set back your thermostat. If you are going to gone for long periods, turn it way down. There is no need to keep the house a toasty 72 if no one is home during the day.
- 9. Have your furnace checked and serviced on a regular basis and get into a habit of changing your furnace filter monthly.
- 10.Check your attic insulation. For the climate zone we live in, the Department of Energy recommends a minimum of R-38 in our attics and up to an R-60. Although the initial cost of adding insulation can be high, the payback begins immediately and will continue for many years to come.

The internet is full low-cost ways for the Do-It-Yourselfer to prepare for winter and save on the monthly heating bill. It is estimated that homeowners can save as much as \$500 annually after receiving weatherization services through Gateway Community Action.
